EXAMINATION RESULTS:

DEPARTMENT OF TAMIL:

I B.A Tamil: The students of I BA Tamil produced 23% in the first semester.

E- Wings: E- Wings is an advanced Spoken English class to enhance the English Speaking skill of the students. The department offered this course for all the students of our college. It was a 20 days course which was conducted after the college hours.

BELITERY '19: The distinctive program of the department of English for the academic year (2018-19) is BELITERY '19 which is the acronym of **Bosco English Lit-Gallery**. It was an Inter-Collegiate Literary Competition conducted on 23rd February 2019. This was the third year of the Inter-Collegiate Competitions. The program was planned with variety of eight literary competitions. The competitions can be divided into two kinds: On Stage and Off Stage Events. There were around 250 students actively participated in each competition.Dr. D.Jockim, Asst. - An Eye camp was conducted on 15.12.2018 by Vasan Eye care from Tuticorin in our college. This camp was organised by YRC & RRC Club members. Totally 209 students were participated and all the staff came forward to check their eyesight.
- On 21st January 2019, Youth Red Cross and Red Ribbon Club of our college organized a Blood Donation Camp in our college. This camp was organized by the Primary Health Centre in Keela Eral. Totally 36 members donated their blood.

<u>AICUF</u>: The Objective of AICUF is to create and support the tolerance of Religion and to work towards the fulfillment of the basic needs and facilities of students, teachers and workers. AICUF was inaugurated on 13/7/18 in our college campus.

- On behalf of AICUF, two days training programme was organized at St. Joseph's College in Trichy on 28th and 29th July 2018. John Britto from III B.Sc Maths, Arputha Raj and John William from III B.A English participated in the program.
- The students from AICUF performed a street play on 1st September, 2018 in our college campus. This street play focused on the evils of NEET examination.
- The students from AICUF performed a street play on 30th January, 2019 in the college assembly. This street play focused on the awareness of social media addition.

<u>**Quiz Club:</u></u>**To select the members of quiz club, a preliminary level exam was conducted on 21st July 2018. 251 students from all over the departments were participated in the preliminary exam and 26 students were selected for the quiz club. The Bosco Quiz-II quiz competition for the colleges and schools was held on 8th February 2019.Totally 10 colleges and 7 schools participated in thecompetition. Prizes were distributed for the winners from both schools and colleges.</u>

<u>Music Club& Arts Club</u>: The main objective of this club is to harness and enhance the talents of the students such as singing and playing music, and make them involve in the college choir and other college programmes. Our College Choir consists of 30 students. The Club, in each department having five singers, creates a platform to sing songs in the assemblies and during First Friday Mass in the church.

- On 21st December 2018, our college celebrated Christmas Day which was organized by the Music club. Music Club organized a choir and sang a carol song as a guest performance.
- On 27thFebruary 2019 our college students participated in musical competition, organized by kovilpatti Shekina Musical School. TEACHING, LEARNING AND EVALUATION

Regarding teaching and learning, the teachers engage various methods that are innovative, participatory and learner friendly. Physical methods like group discussion, study circles, seminars, library reading and peer teaching are followed and also the college encourages ITC supported methods like power point presentations, providing online study materials and notes and/or the soft copies of the same to students. The use of laptops for learning is highly encouraged and facilitated.

Remedial Teaching and Individual Coaching is the part of teaching, learning and evaluation process.

The **written tests** facilitate learning and prepare the students for the Semester Examinations. They are: Unit Test / Internal Tests I & II (1 hour, 25%) and the Model Examination (3 hours).

The Academic Planner detailing the units, sub units, hours and methods of teaching as per syllabus for each Paper, is maintained by every staff and the same is centrally reviewed and monitored towards a well-balanced and evenly spaced covering of the syllabus and an effective and stress free learning for the students.

Remedial Classes

In order to increase the semester results, Remedial classes were conducted students at 2.30 to 3.30 pm regularly. It will be of much help to the students to pass in their examinations. It also helped the staff to complete the portions. Students were given previous year questions to study and prepare themselves for the University Semester Examination. Slow learners were selected from each class and special care was given to them by the staff.

EXTENSION ACTIVITY

Our institution is keen in inspiring our students' to implicate in extension activities to instill their social responsibility. Our students periodically reach out to the neighbouring villages, to the children, youth and keep alive their sense of responsibility towards the society. They spend one hour or two on every week to do their extensional activity by cleaning the college campus. And once in a month, they reach out to the villages, Orphanage homes, Old age homes, to spend time with the needy, create awareness about many social snags among villagers and children, also helping them by cleaning the villages. SPIRITUAL AND HUMAN FORMATION

Religion and ethics:

Religious and ethics classes are conducted once in a week to the students. In multi-religious context the students are given an opportunity to learn one's own religious beliefs, rituals and moral values. Catechism classes are given for the catholic students while others are given moral values education. We aim at the knowledge and respect of not only one's own religion but also other religions, Gods and people of other religions. It is an effort to create not mere religious people but persons of spirituality. We aim to generate a spiritual generation to contribute towards the society.

Mentoring:

Mentoring is to accompany the students in his or her life in the college. Trained professors are appointed as mentors of students. The mentors meet the mentees regularly both individually and as a group and follow up their growth and help them to handle their duties and to face the challenges arising in their academic and personal life.

Counselling

Qualified and experienced youth counsellors are available in the college to guide, counsel and empower the students. The students are encouraged to make use of the services of the counsellors, with prior appointment.

STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICE

The student support service is a multidisciplinary committee that supports and meets students' regularly to evaluate, orate, counsel, guide the behaviors of students that perceived to threaten, harm or disruptive to the student. The Student service committees are always available for students and cheer them to bring their concerns, recommendations and complaints to the team so that they may work to bring about the most positive outcomes for all the concerned.

DBCAS always aim to provide a safe campus environment to the students by following preventive system of St.Don Bosco.

DBCAS has the following committees to help and motivate our students to face their challenges in the factual world.

- 2. Volunteers from Germany
- 3. Bosco Student Solidarity(BOSS)
- 4. Canteen and Store
- 5. College Bus.

Student Welfare Committee

Students Welfare Committee ensures the welfare of student community in all aspects and to resolve their grievances during their stay in campus. The committee recommends on policies relating to students' welfare. On behalf of the committee, Poor children, Orphans, students having one parent are taken into consideration and supported to continue their education through:

- BOSCO Student SolidarityFund
- SitaramJindal Foundation, Bangalore
- Work Scholarship
- Government Scholarship

Once in a week Religion and Ethics sessions are offered for the students. Every month first Friday chapel service is conducted for Christians. If students found sick they are referred to Public Health Centre nearby.

Scholarships

DBCAS is helping out their students by contributing and arranging financial aids like Government Scholarships, Sponsors, working scholarships and fees concession to support the circumstantial for their studies. The following are the details of the management's financial support to the students in this academic year 2018-2019

- SC/ST Scholarships: One hundred and forty six students have received Rs. 9,09,140/- as SC/ST scholarships for the last academic year 2017-18. Ninety Eight students have renewed their application for SC/ST Scholarship this year and Rs.5,98,980/- has sanctioned by the Government of Tamil Nadu in the current academic year and it will be credited to the Student's Savings Bank Account in the forthcoming coming Financial Year. Fresh applications portal for SC/ST scholarship has not been activated yet for this academic year by the Government of Tamil Nadu.
- Sitaram Jindal Scholarships: Sitaram Jintal Scholarships is offered by the same NGO from Bangalore to Boys with more than 65 % marks and Girls with more than 60 % marks to be obtained in the last annual exam. Eight students have applied forSitaram Jindal Scholarship.
- 3. The College Management too has extended financial assistance to deserving students in the following forms.
 - a) Work Scholarship is offered to students who are ready to work to meet their educational expenses. About Forty five students benefit under this scholarship. About Rs.1,50,0000/- have been disbursed under this scholarship programme to students.

BOSS (Bosco Student Solidarity)

BOSS Fund is a collective, voluntary initiative of DBCAS student community as an expression of their solidarity with the fellow students in need. Every student contributes a minimum of Rs.10/- and Staff contribute minimum of Rs. 100/- every month towards this

fund and the money thus collected is deposited in a special account and operated by the management and are contributed towards the deserving students.

The contribution of the students and staff for the current academic year is Rs.80,000/-

Driving License:

Our college provides opportunity for the students to learn four wheeler driving and to get license for staff and students. A staff from Harish Driving School, Ettayapuram is offering driving class for the students and also helping them to get license in RTO office Kovilpatti with discount. There are about 15 students who got driving license from our college in this academic year.

Voter Identity Card:

Our college encourages the students who is 18 years old, to apply for the Voter Identity Card. Voter ID card forms were distributed to fill and collected from the students. 125 application forms for Voter ID have been filled and submitted to the Tahsildar of Ettayapuram from our college.

Canteen and Stores

DBCAS has a spacious canteen in the College premises and is run by the College Management. A variety of South Indian foods, snacks items are provided at highly subsidized rates with highest quality.

General stores meet up students' academic requirements by facilitating spiral binding, taking photocopies, print outs and stationary items.

Transportation Facility

For the security and added comfort DBCAS provide buses for the transportation of the students and faculties. A fleet of 4 buses ply to Thoothukudi (west), Thoothukudi (east), Villathikulam, and Tharuvaikulam, The routes and pickup points are clearly laid out for commuting various places of the city and villages.

HOSTEL REPORT

Bosco Hostel for Boys:

The Bosco Hostel is a confluence of students from different background. It serves the poor and marginalized youth of the district of Tuticorin, Tirunelveli and other districts too. In order to give educational support to these youngsters, Bosco Hostel was started in 2014 at Keela Eral in Thuthookudi. Now it has successfully completed 4 full years. The academic year 2018-2019 was started with 64 students. Rev. Fr. Thiviya Alexander and Bro. Rex act as the Warden and sub- warden respectively.

FRESHER'S PARTY

On 6th July 2018 Fresher's Party was celebrated to create healthy ambiance for the students who joined in the first year.

MARIAN MONTH

From 16th July 2018 to 16th August 2018, Marian Month was celebrated. Various competitions were conducted to bring out the talents of our students. The programme ended with Marian Night on 16th August 2018.
