Don't you know, we are all 'Icons of one God?'



Stolen (Novel) by Lucy Christopher

It is strange that at sometimes the people whom we wish we never become turn out to be our reason for living. Lucy Christopher's debut novel Stolen (2009) is a very good example for this. The novel begins with Gemma Toombs' recollection to her therapist of her ordeal as a captive in the Australian desert.



Gemma Toombs, a sixteen-year-old school girl, is abducted from Bangkok Airport to the Australian desert by Ty, a twenty-five-year-old young man. Ty is a handsome man who has built a beautiful place for himself in the middle of the desert with all the needed things for years stored. Ty treats his captive so well. He serves her and does all that she needs.

The only thing he expects from her is love. Gemma hates Ty and wants to escape from Ty by all means. A few times Ty permits her to escape but she is unable to make it through the long desert. Every time she is brought back and tendered even more lovingly by Ty. Gemma begins to like Ty even though she hates him apparently. When Gemma is bitten by a snake in the desert Ty saves her by taking her to a hospital in Perth from where he is arrested. When she is rescued, she feels so much for Ty that she wishes that he walks free from the prison.

She imagines as if living with Ty. She develops a kind of Stockholm syndrome in which she sympathises and justifies the captor's behaviour. At the close of the novel Gemma is clueless as to how to testify in the court of law. Her anger towards her captor begins to change into one of sympathy and even love.

The novel is written in the form of letters written to Ty by Gemma recalling her harrowing experience as a captor. Lucy Christopher in her debut novel Stolen gives a detailed account of the desert geography and its harsh conditioning. The novel is gripping in its detail and is unputdownable to anyone who wishes to read a psychological thriller.


